## Background

Since 2022, the UNESCO Chairs in Germany have been holding biennial conferences on topics relevant to their specific area of expertise and to the United Nations' Agenda 2030.

The 2026 International UNESCO Chairs Conference 'International Cooperation in Higher Education and TVET: Bridging the Gap Between the Theory and Practice of the SDGs' will bring together experts from academia, policy and practice to discuss addressing global sustainability challenges through practical, research-based solutions.

The conference aims to highlight innovative approaches to higher education and TVET which actively support the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals through research, development and implementation strategies, as well as teaching and learning practices.

The conference will feature keynote speeches and workshops led by UNESCO chairs in their respective fields of expertise. Participants will have the opportunity to take part in excursions to the Ruhr region, exploring sites that are relevant to the SDGs.

The conference aims to facilitate contact between researchers and policymakers from Germany and abroad, with a special focus on Southeast Asia, to promote cross-regional collaboration in advancing the SDGs in higher education and TVET.
